Reduce Waste at Source

Members of the public could start with the details of daily life, such as reducing the use of disposable products and reusing or donating materials at home, offices or other occasions.

Practise Source Separation and Clean Recycling

Members of the public could properly sort their waste, practise clean recycling and recycle recyclables through appropriate channels. For example, people could deliver recyclables to the Environmental Protection Department's community recycling network GREEN@COMMUNITY, or make good use of the recycling facilities and arrangements of the premises.

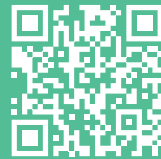

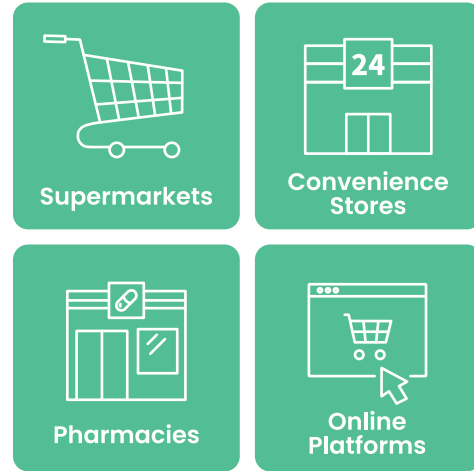

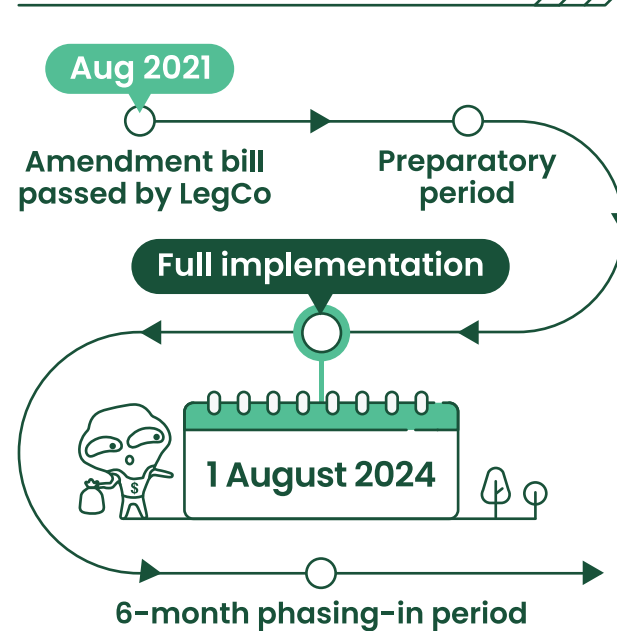

How to Buy Designated Bags/Designated Labels?

From February 2024, it is expected that members of the public could purchase designated bags and designated labels at a few thousands of authorised outlets. The list of authorised outlets will be uploaded to the MSW charging thematic website.



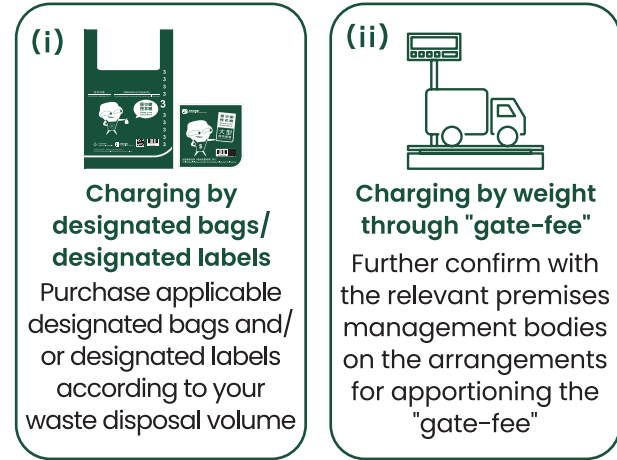
Implementation Timetable



How to Prepare?

1 Determine the Applicable Charging Mode(s) of the Premises

Confirm with the premises management bodies, e.g., property management companies, owners' corporations, owners' organisations or cleansing contractors, etc., the waste collection arrangement(s) used by the premises and the applicable charging mode(s).



2 Calculate Monthly Expenditure on MSW Charging

Members of the public are encouraged to try the Waste Reduction Calculator to calculate the expenditure on MSW charging and learn how to save more by practising source separation and recycling.

What is MSW Charging?

In line with the "polluter-pays" principle, the waste disposed of by all sectors in Hong Kong will be subject to charging based on its quantity to drive behavioural changes in waste generation within the community that leads to waste reduction at source and clean recycling practice, hence reducing the overall waste disposal amount.



How to Charge?

The applicable charging mode(s) depends on the waste collection arrangement(s) used by the waste producers.
